Top 5 Signs Your Interview Went Well

1. Interview went longer than expected

Typically when the duration of the interview lasts longer than the scheduled time, the interviewer feels you are worth his or her time. On the other hand, if the interview takes less time than expected, you might not have been of interest to the interviewer.

2. Making plans for the future

When the interviewer starts to talk about specific duties or goals pertaining to you, this is a good sign that he or she has positioned you in the future of the company. This would then be a perfect time to express your future contributions to both the position you are interviewing for and the company.

3. You both shared personal things

Sometimes the interview may go off topic into a personal conversation with joking or laughing. This is a good sign that your personality may be a fit with the culture of the company. Personality fit is imperative during a job interview and is often taken into consideration as much as your skills and abilities.

4. Definitive answer on when they will call you back

Everyone has heard "We'll be in touch" or "We'll let you know" without being given a time frame of when this will happen. This usually means they have not yet made a decision and additional interviews are still taking place. When you hear "I'll call you on Friday at 3pm", it lets you know that there is some level of interest. Continue to show your enthusiasm in the position until a decision is made.

5. Interviewer is selling you the business

You may find that the interviewer is spending a lot of time giving thorough details regarding the position or company. This could mean that he or she wants you to be interested in the position as much as the interviewer might be interested in you. The interviewer will tend to spend less time with questions and answers if he or she feels they are not interested.
